GETTING HERE

STORE STREET BY TUBE OR BUS
The nearest tube stations are Godege Street (Northern line), Tottenham Court Road (Northern and Central line) and Warren Street (Victoria line) all within walking distance.
Buses run from south to north on Tottenham Court Road (nearest stop Percy Street) and north to south on Gower Street (nearest stop Chenies Street).

STORE STREET BY BIKE
The nearest Barclays cycle hire docking stations are on Alfred Place and Bayley Street, Bloomsbury.

STORE STREET BY CAR
Store Street is one-way with access from Tottenham Court Road. There is limited metered parking Monday to Saturday, 8.30am to 6.00pm. (No charge on Sunday).
There are a number of NCP and council car parks in the area.
Store Street is within the Congestion Charge Zone.

Caffe Paradiso & Ristorante Olivelli

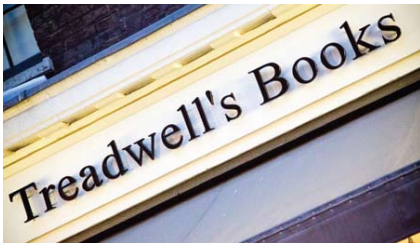

The Building Centre and NLA

The Building Centre was established in 1931 developing into an iconic forum dedicated to providing information and inspiration to all sectors of the built environment. NLA is open six days a week and receives over 10,000 visitors each month.
